- Grants an opportunity to positively impact your local blue and green spaces.






## **Training**

At the start of all activities, you will receive an induction so that you know what you'll be doing. We also provide regular certificated training opportunities for our volunteers.

If required we will carry out a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check at no cost to the volunteer. Events requiring a DBS will be outlined in the description of the event.
